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ABOUT REPORT



The 2025–26 Annual Report highlights the journey, achievements, and impact of **Kisan Bharti Vikas Sansthan (KBVS)** from **April 2025 to March 2026**. Throughout the year, the organization remained committed to strengthening rural communities across Rajasthan through inclusive, community-led, and sustainable development initiatives.



Guided by the principles of **equity, participation, and sustainability**, KBVS implemented integrated programmes focusing on **Early Childhood Care and Education (ECCE), Water Security**, Climate Resilience, Gender Equality, and Community Empowerment. By working closely with local communities, government institutions, and development partners, the organization promoted holistic development while addressing the interconnected challenges of nutrition, education, natural resource management, and social inclusion.

During the reporting period, KBVS successfully implemented two major development programmes across **Desuri Block in Pali District and Jhadol Block in Udaipur District**. With the support of the **Jiv Daya Foundation**, the organization strengthened early childhood care, nutrition, and learning opportunities for children from vulnerable families, while also extending essential support to economically disadvantaged households. In partnership with **Asia Initiatives**, KBVS implemented community-led interventions in **Jhadol Block, Udaipur District**, focusing on groundwater recharge, watershed development, plantation drives, restoration of traditional water harvesting structures, and awareness on sustainable natural resource management to enhance climate resilience and water security.

Gender equality remained a cross-cutting priority across all programmes. KBVS actively promoted women's participation in community institutions, decision-making processes, and development initiatives, recognizing that empowered women are central to resilient families, sustainable livelihoods, and inclusive rural development.

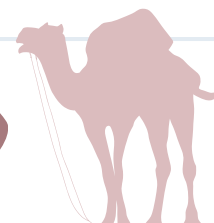

With the support of **Jiv Daya Foundation**, Kisan Bharti Vikas Sansthan operated **three community-based Early Childhood Learning & Nutrition Centres in Desuri Block** to promote **Early Childhood Care and Education (ECCE)** among tribal communities. The centres ran for 3 hours daily for children aged 3 to 6 years, providing a safe, child-friendly environment with play-based learning, storytelling, creative activities, cognitive development, school readiness, and daily nutritional support through milk and biscuits.

KEY PROGRAMME COMPONENTS

- Daily 3-hour Early Childhood Learning Sessions for children aged 3–6 years.
- Play-based learning to develop language, numeracy, creativity, and social skills.
- Daily Milk & Biscuit Nutrition Programme to support child health and nutrition.
- Distribution of educational and child support materials, including school bags, uniforms, sweaters, shoes, and other essential learning supplies.
- Regular engagement with parents and caregivers to encourage children's education, nutrition, and holistic development.



PROGRAMME IMPACT

- **100 children** enrolled in Early Childhood Learning & Nutrition Centres.
- Improved school readiness, cognitive skills, and early learning among children.
- Daily milk and biscuits provided to support child nutrition.



- 100 children received school bags, uniforms, sweaters, shoes, and learning materials.
- Better school attendance and smoother transition to formal education.
- 150 vulnerable tribal families received emergency ration kits.
- Food assistance improved household food security and nutrition.
- Increased parent awareness on early childhood education and nutrition.
- Strengthened community support for holistic child development.

Kisan Bharti Vikas Sansthan (KBVS), in partnership with **Asia Initiatives**, implemented the **Revival of Traditional Water Structures** through **SoCCs-Based Community Engagement** project in the tribal villages of **Jhadol Block, Udaipur District**. The initiative aimed to revive traditional water harvesting systems, strengthen groundwater recharge, and enhance climate resilience through active community participation. By adopting the **Social Capital Credits (SoCCs)** model, local communities played a central role in restoring critical water infrastructure and protecting natural resources.

- Restore traditional water harvesting structures.
- Improve groundwater recharge and water availability.
- Promote climate-resilient natural resource management.
- Strengthen community ownership through the SoCCs approach.
- Enhance environmental sustainability through plantation and soil conservation.

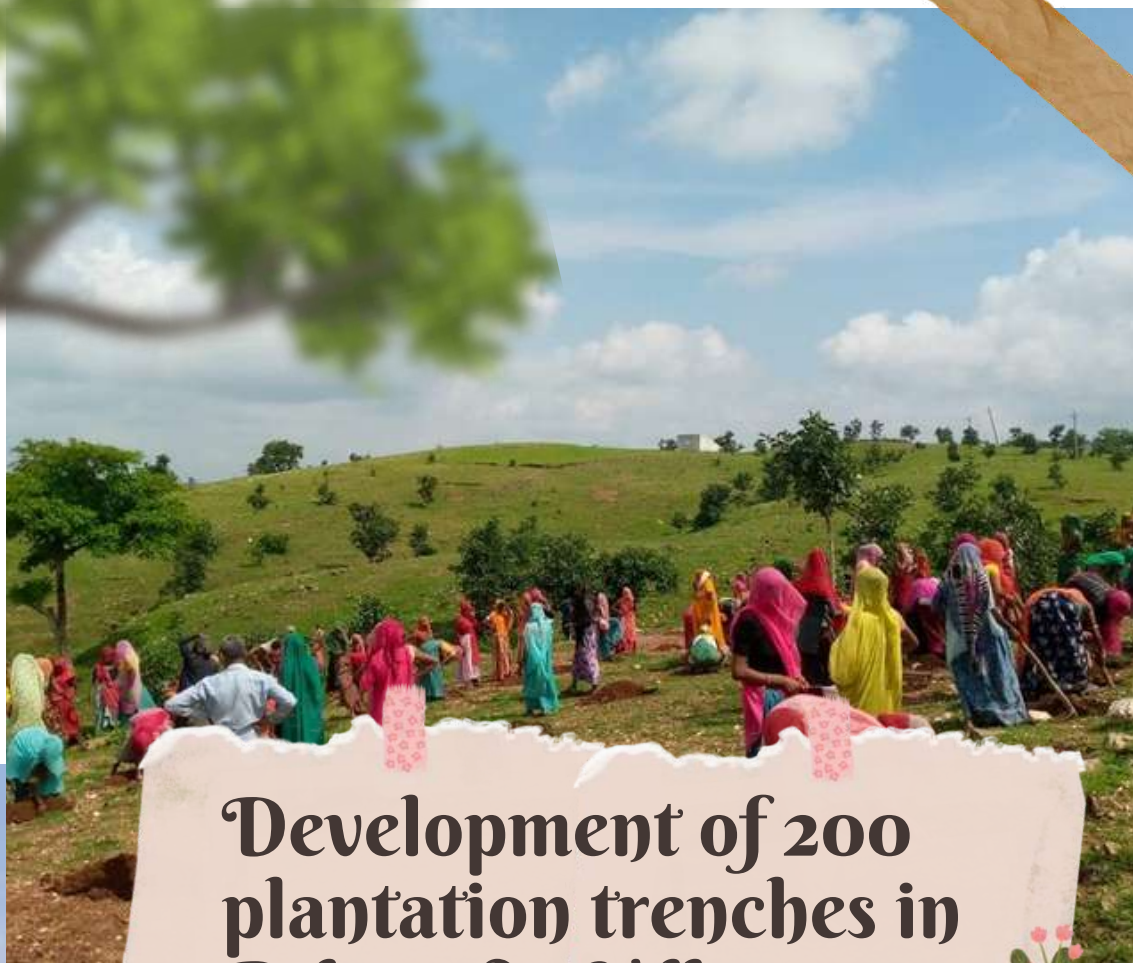

GENDER EQUALITY, LEADERSHIP & MENSTRUAL HEALTH



At Kisan Bharti Vikas Sansthan (KBVS), gender equality is integrated across all programmes and organizational processes. The organization believes that strengthening leadership, enhancing staff capacities, and promoting awareness on health and dignity are essential for achieving sustainable community development.

Organizational Capacity Building

As part of KBVS's commitment to strengthening institutional capacity, **Ms. Swati Gehlot, Programme Coordinator**, participated in the **Rise Up Leadership Programme – Cohort 4 in November 2025**. The seven-week leadership programme, held in **Udaipur**, focused on **organizational development, leadership, strategic communication, networking, partnership building, and proposal writing**.



The knowledge and skills gained through the programme strengthened KBVS's institutional capacity, enhanced programme planning and communication, improved networking with development organizations, and contributed to building a stronger and more collaborative team within the organization.



PROMOTING MENSTRUAL HEALTH AND WASH



Following the **Rise Up Leadership Programme**, KBVS strengthened its efforts to promote **Menstrual Health and WASH (Water, Sanitation and Hygiene)** among adolescent girls through school and community-based awareness initiatives in **Pali District, Rajasthan**. The programme aimed to improve menstrual health knowledge, challenge social stigma, and encourage safe hygiene practices while creating supportive environments for adolescent girls.

Key Activities

- Conducted Menstrual Hygiene Awareness Sessions in 20 Government Schools.
- Reached 1,250 adolescent girls through comprehensive WASH and menstrual health education.
- Organized interactive sessions with teachers and parents to strengthen support for adolescent health and well-being.
- Conducted 20 community awareness meetings to address myths, misconceptions, and stigma surrounding menstruation.
- Promoted safe menstrual hygiene practices, menstrual dignity, and access to accurate health information.
- Encouraged open dialogue on adolescent health, gender equality, and WASH within schools and communities.



Key Outcomes

- 20 Government Schools actively participated in menstrual health and WASH awareness initiatives.
- 1,250 adolescent girls gained improved knowledge and confidence to manage menstruation safely and with dignity.
- Increased awareness among teachers, parents, and community members, fostering a supportive environment for adolescent girls.
- Reduced myths and misconceptions related to menstruation through community engagement and dialogue.
- Strengthened awareness of WASH practices, contributing to healthier school environments and improved hygiene behaviours.
- Enhanced KBVS's institutional capacity by integrating leadership learning into community-based gender and health initiatives.



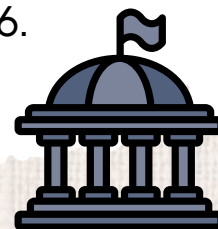
